- communicate information and ideas with some adaptation to the intended reader
- link a short linear sequence of ideas using discourse markers and conjunctions
- demonstrate some awareness of conventions of an informal and formal letter

Task Fulfilment	5	The candidate generally writes a connected text with brief narratives and descriptions on a familiar and straightforward topic despite the common errors encountered at A2 level. The candidate generally covers most of the task points and there is some variety in descriptions, but they should have elaborated more by giving more varied examples and details when covering the task points.
Accuracy and Range of Grammar	4	The candidate generally uses basic grammatical structures correctly, including conjunctions, connectives and discourse markers (errors do not impede a sympathetic reader's understanding). The candidate employs some complex grammatical structures encountered at A2 level. The candidate does not always use punctuation marks accurately and the capitalisation throughout the text may also be an indication of this. Examples of errors: 1) "to visited" 2) "the conditions of the animals was" 3) "and them feel lake at they normal habitad" Examples of complex grammatical structures: words in bold in the text
Accuracy and Range of Vocabulary	4	The candidate generally uses vocabulary adequately to meet straightforward needs although there are frequent spelling mistakes which sometimes hinder understanding. The candidate employs some complex structures and vocabulary encountered at A2 level. Examples of complex structures and vocabulary encountered at A2 level: words in red in the text
Organisation and Coherence	3	The candidate generally communicates information and ideas by demonstrating some awareness of the conventions of the intended piece of writing. There is limited use of paragraphing, discourse markers and conjunctions.

Criteria	Mark	Examiner's Comments
Task Fulfilment	2	The candidate fails to adhere to the word limit and thus, most of the task points are not covered. Some ideas are expressed but it is thought that they are insufficient and not necessarily relevant to the task.
Accuracy and Range of Grammar	2	The candidate generally uses some basic grammatical structures correctly, but frequent errors occur. The candidate does not always use punctuation marks accurately and the capitalisation throughout the text may also be an indication of this. Examples of errors: 1) "when we writted" 2) "tha I was tell"
Accuracy and Range of Vocabulary	3	The candidate uses some vocabulary adequately to meet straightforward needs although there are frequent spelling mistakes which can hinder understanding.
Organisation and Coherence	2	The candidate communicates some information and ideas but there is limited use of discourse markers and conjunctions. There is no paragraphing.
