# ACHIEVER LEVEL – B1

## WRITING

### The candidate will be able to:

- write straightforward connected texts on a range of familiar topics
- write short simple formal letters to ask for and convey simple information
- write short simple texts for practical purposes, e.g. instructions
- write short informal letters on topics of personal interest and knowledge
- write brief narratives and descriptions on straightforward topics
- express opinions simply, giving supporting reasons
- use correct punctuation in formal and informal texts
- spell correctly the majority of common words and key words relating to work, study and leisure interests
- use basic grammatical structures correctly, including conjunctions, connectives and discourse markers (errors do not impede a sympathetic reader's understanding)
- use vocabulary adequately to meet straightforward needs
- communicate information and ideas with some adaptation to the intended reader
- link a short linear sequence of ideas using discourse markers and conjunctions
- demonstrate some awareness of conventions of an informal and formal letter

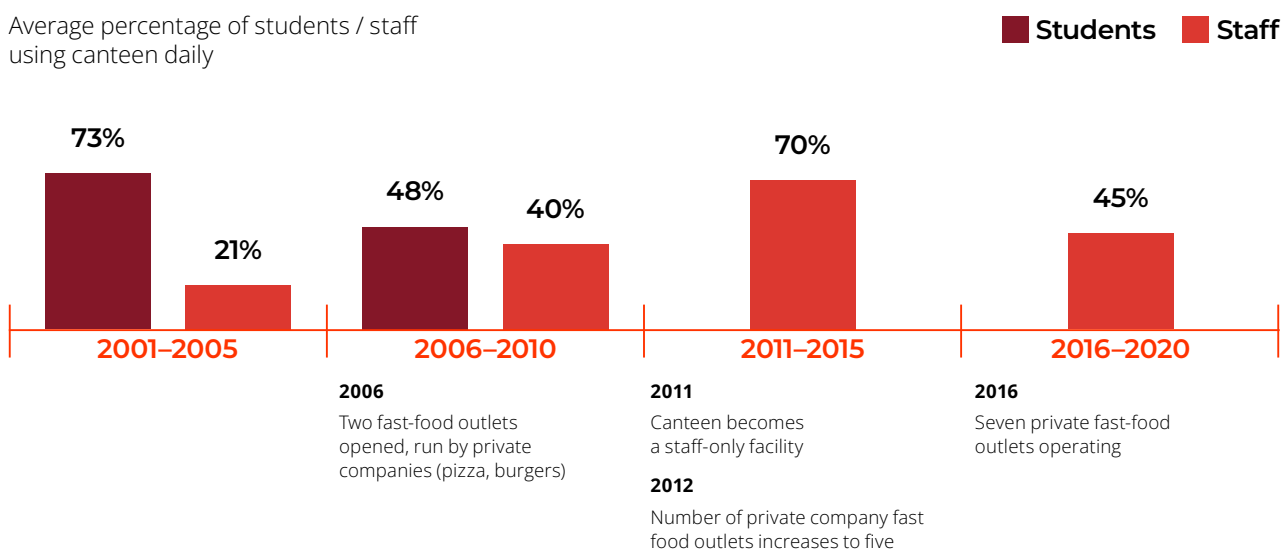
Your university has a large canteen, serving a variety of hot meals. The canteen is now used only by staff. As part of a short course in English, you have to write a report on changing use of the canteen over time. You have been given the following information for the period 2001 to 2020: a chart showing who used the canteen when, plus a timeline showing developments that affected use of the canteen.


In your report, you should:

- describe the main trends
- give reason for these trends
- predict how use of the canteen is likely to change in the next five-year period.

## Canteen Usage 2001-2020

Average percentage of students / staff using canteen daily



Write between 150 and 200 words. 

### Sample Script

The main trends of canteen:

The Bar graphs show the canteen is being less popular, the using percentage is **decreasing**.

The reasons of these trends:

The first **impact** was two fast-food stores opened in 2006, that made students gone there (1) and left from canteen. That moment the staff came to canteen more than before, it could be the space **issue** was solved (there were more space (2) than before).

The second reason was number of fast-food stores opened in 2012. After this period, students completely left from canteen and the situation became worse after seven fast-food stores opened in 2016. They don't use the canteen (3).

Prediction to change in next five-year period:

If the canteen change **the operation**, it will be worse and should be close it.

# Examiner's Comments

Criteria	Mark	Examiner's Comments
<b>Task Fulfilment</b>	<b>3</b>	The candidate writes a generally connected text by presenting most of the relevant points. However, it is felt that the candidate should have elaborated more by comparing the trends and the changes to a greater extent and by further commenting on the anticipated changes in the next five-year period (which is also evident by the fact that the candidate fails to adhere to the word limit as they have written 126 words).
<b>Accuracy and Range of Grammar</b>	<b>3</b>	<p>The candidate generally uses basic grammatical structures correctly, although frequent errors occur, and the use of conjunctions and connectives is limited.</p> <p>The candidate generally tries to employ some complex structures encountered at B1 level, but these attempts are accompanied by some errors.</p> <p>The candidate generally uses punctuation marks accurately.</p> <p><i>Examples of errors:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) "...that made students gone there..."</li> <li>2) "...there were more space..."</li> <li>3) "They don't use the canteen."</li> </ol>
<b>Accuracy and Range of Vocabulary</b>	<b>3</b>	<p>The candidate generally uses words and expressions appropriate to the topic and purpose of writing although there are some errors, and it is felt that the candidate should have used a wider range of linking words effectively to show the relationship between ideas.</p> <p>The candidate generally uses some complex lexical structures. However, there are some misspelled words ("graphes", "worese").</p> <p><i>Examples of complex structures and vocabulary encountered at B1 level: words in red in the text</i></p>
<b>Organisation and Coherence</b>	<b>3</b>	<p>The text is generally coherent, but some errors impede the natural flow of the text and may inhibit the reader's understanding.</p> <p>Although the candidate generally organizes their ideas, it is felt that they should have used linking words and other relevant cohesive devices to a greater extent in order to reflect the structure of the ideas expressed.</p>

# Examiner's Comments

Criteria	Mark	Examiner's Comments
<b>Task Fulfilment</b>	<b>2</b>	The candidate generally expresses their opinion simply by giving some supporting reasons. However, they fail to demonstrate awareness of the conventions of a formal piece of writing, and it is felt that some ideas are expressed but it is thought that they are insufficient and not necessarily relevant to the task (which is also evident by the fact that the candidate fails to adhere to the word limit as they have written 201 words).
<b>Accuracy and Range of Grammar</b>	<b>2</b>	The candidate generally uses some basic grammatical structures correctly, but frequent errors occur.  The candidate does not always use punctuation marks accurately.  <i>Examples of errors:</i> 1) "...it bringed..." 2) "...will contact with..." 3) "...makes it found difficult..."
<b>Accuracy and Range of Vocabulary</b>	<b>3</b>	The candidate generally uses words and expressions appropriate to the topic and purpose of writing although there are some errors, and it is felt that the candidate should have used a wider range of linking words effectively to show the relationship between ideas.  The candidate generally uses some complex lexical structures. However, there are some misspelled words ("loneliness", "socialing", "indipent").  <i>Examples of complex structures and vocabulary encountered at B1 level: words in red in the text</i>
<b>Organisation and Coherence</b>	<b>3</b>	The candidate generally communicates information and ideas by trying to show awareness of the basic organisation of a text. However, there is limited use of linking words, discourse markers and conjunctions, which leads to errors and disruption in the cohesion and coherence of the text.
<b>Total Score</b>	<b>10</b>
