



## SPEAKING PERFORMANCE



Criteria	Mark (0-6)	Evaluation
Task Completion and Communicative Effect	4	The test taker generally answers the questions satisfactorily and provides relevant details. However, there are moments when she hesitates or requires clarification (e.g., 'I'm not sure what this means'), which affects the overall fluency. She exhibits ability to organise ideas and describe the personal significance of events.
Fluency and Discourse Management	3	She demonstrates a reasonable level of fluency but frequently hesitates and relies on fillers (e.g., 'eer', 'umm'), which disrupt the flow of speech. Although she maintains a conversational tone, the frequent pauses indicate difficulty in formulating responses under pressure, affecting overall fluency.
Accuracy and Range of Grammar	3	She is reasonably accurate with simple structures though basic errors are also evident (e.g., 'For example, in my office are people that I like,' 'I very like jokes,' and 'might to be better'). While these errors affect clarity, they do not significantly impede overall understanding.
Accuracy and Range of Vocabulary	3	Her vocabulary is generally appropriate for the tasks, incorporating relevant work-related terms such as 'master's degree,' 'data analyst,' or 'market research.' However, she struggles with more specific or advanced terms. Inaccurate choice of words, such as 'we do fun of each other,' occasionally detracts from the overall effectiveness of communication.
Pronunciation and Intonation	3	Her pronunciation is generally clear, aiding understanding, though there are occasional mispronunciations. There are issues with stress patterns, and her intonation is relatively flat, making the speech sound somewhat monotonous.
Total score CEFR level: B1	16 (out of 30)	Overall: The test taker shows a fair level of understanding and engagement with the tasks, successfully sharing personal opinions and experiences. However, improving fluency and elaborating on key points would enhance her interactive skills. Focusing on grammatical accuracy, reducing the use of fillers, and varying intonation will further clarify her responses. Overall, this is a solid performance for a B1 test taker, with room for improvement in all areas.
