Criteria	Mark (0-6)	Evaluation
Task Completion and Communicative Effect	5	The test taker addresses all questions with relevant answers, providing examples and explanations. The responses are generally complete and show an ability to engage in the conversation effectively.
Fluency and Discourse Management	4	He speaks fluently with only occasional pauses to gather thoughts, particularly when discussing complex ideas. Despite these interruptions, the overall flow is mostly coherent, allowing for effective communication.
Accuracy and Range of Grammar	4	He shows a solid grasp of grammar with a range of simple and complex structures. Some errors are present ('you must to have,' 'more easy'), but they do not impede understanding.
Accuracy and Range of Vocabulary	4	He employs a variety of vocabulary relevant to the topics discussed. He effectively uses terms related to their field (e.g., 'market research', 'engineering firm') while the few instances of incorrect phrasing do not impede conveying the intended meaning.
Pronunciation and Intonation	4	His pronunciation is generally clear and understandable, with some variation in intonation. Some words are mispronounced, and sentence stress is not always effective but that does not hinder comprehension.
Total score CEFR level: B2	21 (out of 30)	Overall: The test taker demonstrates effective communication skills at B2 level, providing clear ideas and relevant examples on various topics. While he engages well in discussion and shows a good range of vocabulary, there are minor hesitations, grammatical inaccuracies and some ineffective intonation patterns that indicate areas for improvement.
